Learn About 2011 SPLOST – Monday, Nov 7 & Wednesday, Nov 2

There will be two opportunities to learn about the 2011 Special Purpose Local Option Sales Tax (SPLOST) up for voter approval on the November 8th ballot for Glynn County residents. 2011 SPLOST is a 5 year 1% sales tax to fund various county projects. More details of the proposed projects can be viewed at <http://glynncounty.org> website, click on the Government tab in the center and follow the drop down tabs to 2011 SPLOST, then open the SPLOST 6 Project tab. Jekyll Island is slated to receive \$2.7 M through projects submitted by the Jekyll Island Authority.

The regularly scheduled JICA monthly meeting on Monday, November 7 will include a SPLOST presentation. It will be held at the Jekyll Island Community Presbyterian Church and starts at 2:00pm. Clyde Taylor, Glynn County Commissioner along with local businessman, Steve Swan will be making the presentation and answering questions.

There is another opportunity on Wednesday, November 2, at the Jekyll Island Rotary Club weekly meeting held at the Jekyll Island Club Hotel. Breakfast will start at 7:30am followed by the meeting at 8:00am. A portion of the meeting will be devoted to the 2011 SPLOST issue. Clyde & Sam will be making the presentation. The meetings normally conclude by 9:00am. The cost of the breakfast is \$10.00.

Remember Election Day is Tuesday, November 8, 2011. Take time to learn about this issue that will help Glynn County & Jekyll Island.
